Electronic publication information, including version number (if relevant and if not part of title), name of any sponsoring institution, date of electronic publication (or last update), and URL (without https://), DOI, or Permalink. Date of Access.</p> <p>for example, Willet, Perry. <i>Victorian Women Writers Project</i>. Indiana U, 2016, webapp1.dlib.indiana.edu/vwwp/welcome.do. Accessed 14 Dec. 2016.</p>	<p>Include as much of the following as is available:</p> <p>Author, A.A. (Date). Subtitle of work. <i>Title of work</i>.</p> <p>for example, Willet, P. (Ed.) Include page number of PDF file if available.</p> <p>for example, (<i>Victorian</i>).</p>	<p>Follow the author-date method of in-text citation if the information is available. Include page number of PDF file if available.</p> <p>for example, (Willet, 2003, p. 4).</p>	<p>Web sites may be cited in running text instead of in an in-text citation. Use the first entry in the formal citation for in text citations. Include page number of PDF file if available.</p> <p>for example, (Smith 2001).</p>
